WHEN YOU DON'T HAVE A CONTAINER

Sharps containers may be obtained from your doctor, hospital, health insurance provider, medical supplier, pharmacist, or online. In some cases, they can be obtained free of charge.

MendoRecycle also offers free sharps containers at its 3200 Taylor Road location in Ukiah while supplies last.

If you are unable to obtain an approved sharps container you may make your own using the following steps:



Place sharps in an empty hard plastic laundry detergent or bleach bottle



DO NOT use soft plastic containers like milk jugs, soda bottles, plastic bags or coffee cans



Screw the lid shut and secure it with strong tape



Clearly label the bottle "SHARPS" with a permanent marker

WHAT TO DO WITH USED SHARPS

Proper disposal of sharps can keep you, your family, and community safe.



DO keep sharps away from children & pets



DO immediately dispose of sharps in a sharps container



DO bring full sharps container to a sharps disposal program.

DISPOSAL OPTIONS

Drop off full sharps containers at MendoRecycle, participating sharps collection centers like a pharmacy, doctor's office, or household hazardous waste center. You may also mail your full sharps containers to participating mail-in collection programs.

ABOUT SHARPS

Approximately 7 billion sharps are thrown in the trash every year causing dangers for those who handle waste and recycling.

Improper disposal or mishandling of used sharps can spread life-threatening diseases and cause months of expensive medical tests.

Not only is it vital for the safety of the community to properly dispose of sharps, it is also illegal to throw them in the trash or recycling. It is a public health and environmental issue.



Examples of common sharps are: needles, auto injectors, infusion sets, syringes, lancets, and connection sets.

WHAT NOT TO DO WITH USED SHARPS

Improperly discarded sharps can injure people and spread disease. You can project your family and community by following these simple rules.



DO NOT throw sharps in the trash



DO NOT throw sharps in the recycling



DO NOT flush sharps down the toilet

TO AVOID INJURY

DO NOT break needles

NOT recap needles

DO NOT remove needle
DO NOT force needles into container

DO NOT reach into sharps container
