It sadly has come to our attention that Collective Hotels and Retreats, Inc. wish to build a resort and campground located at 33380 Pine Mountain Road, Hopland. We are asking that you please consider not allowing this site to be built.

We have spent many wonderful times up on Pine Mountain at our brother's property, enjoying the peace and solitude that the mountain has to offer. Not only will the campground affect many residences along Pine Mountain Road because of the increase in traffic o 30-40 more vehicles a day (not counting the events), but it will have a direct impact on our brother's property.

First, as we understand the plans, the parking lot will be located next to our brother's pond and will be visible from his house.
