Explanation of Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Program Assignment Agreement

The California Department of Mental Health (DMH) allocated a portion of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funding to each county for Prevention & Early Intervention (PEI) Statewide Projects. These projects include Suicide Prevention, the Student Mental Health Initiative, and Stigma and Discrimination Reduction. In March 2009, Mendocino County, like many others, assigned its allocations for fiscal years 08/09 through 11/12 back to DMH to enable the State to implement these projects more cohesively and to avoid the county administrative costs the projects would require. Since that time, development and implementation of these projects have been delayed at the State level, and some counties have formed a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) to implement the projects independently as an alternative. The JPA is named the California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA).

There is no option for counties to recover the funding once it has been assigned to DMH. However, the State recently offered the opportunity to counties that had previously assigned their allocations to DMH, to reassign their allocations to fund a contract between DMH and CalMHSA to develop and implement the Statewide projects. In addition, CalMHSA's membership has grown as more counties have chosen to join the JPA. Membership allows counties to participate more actively in the design of the projects and to implement them more expeditiously while still avoiding prohibitive local administrative costs. At its meeting on July 21, 2010, the Mendocino County Mental Health Board voted to approve a motion to support Mendocino County's joining CalMHSA and reassigning its PEI Statewide Projects allocations for fiscal years 08/09 through 11/12 to fund a contract between DMH and CalMHSA. The form, entitled "Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Programs Assignment Agreement" posted herein, is Mendocino County's notification to DMH to reassign its available planning funds and allocations to fund the contract between DMH and CalMHSA. If the Board of Supervisors approves, this document will be sent to the State along with a Board Resolution authorizing Mendocino County's membership in CalMHSA.
