Response to Grand Jury

The Mendocino County Board of Education would like to thank the Grand Jury for conducting this investigation and making reasonable recommendations. It is of great value to bring these problems to the attention of the general-public including the following points:

- 1. School food service programs are severely under-funded. This is the primary factor inhibiting the improvement of student meals.
- 2. In many districts in the county, 60% of students come from a family with a low enough income to qualify them for a free lunch.
- 3. In order to provide children with an adequate diet, many school districts are offering three meals a day and meals during the summer.

Our statement specifying any portion of the FINDINGS that are disputed with an explanation of the reasons therefore:

- **F8** This is not true for all districts. (Certainly not in Fort Bragg.)
- **F11** Not true for all districts and easily corrected at the school level.
- **F12** An issue for union representation.

Our responses to the RECOMMENDATIONS portion of the report as follows:

- R1 The Board of Education agrees that a full time Nutrition Services Director would be a valuable asset for school districts in the county. However, since the county Superintendent is the employer and the Board of Education is not, there is no authority to impose staffing requirements on MCOE or the district offices. The issue of funding is a primary consideration and would involve the local districts. At a time when employee health benefits are projected to go up 17%, pension payments are increasing, and all other expenses are increasing beyond the COLA, it is questionable whether funding the Director position is possible. Short term contracting with a dietician might be a more affordable option.
- **R2 & R3** The Board of Education sees the possibility of MCOE working with districts in review of these recommendations to determine ways in which this might occur.
- R4 The Board of Education and superintendent have previously discussed working with district superintendents to assist the food service directors to meet and exchange information. The Board of Education would like to see site visitations.
- **R5 & R6** These recommendations are the sole responsibility of the local districts.
