<sup>1</sup> Health and Safety Code section 11352(b) denotes a felony conviction for transportation for sale of heroin from a non-contiguous county. Likewise, Health and Safety Code section 11379(b) denotes a felony conviction for transportation for sale of methamphetamine from a non-contiguous county.

<sup>2</sup> Health and Safety Code section 11379(a) denotes a felony conviction for transportation for sale of methamphetamine. Penal Code section 667.5(b) denotes a true finding on a sentencing enhancement for having served a prior prison term and failing to remain free of custody or conviction for five years following release.

<sup>3</sup> Penal Code section 487(a) denotes a felony conviction for grand theft in a value of \$951 or greater. Penal Code section 12022.1(a) denotes a true finding on a sentencing enhancement for having committed a new felony while released from custody on a pending felony.

<sup>4</sup> Penal Code section 32 denotes a felony conviction for being an accessory (after the fact) to a felony committed by another.

<sup>5</sup> Penal Code section 1320(b) denotes a felony conviction for willfully failing to appear in court as ordered on a felony case after having signed a written promise to appear.

<sup>6</sup> Penal Code section 530.5(a) denotes a felony conviction for a form of identity theft.

<sup>7</sup> Vehicle Code section 10851(a) denotes a felony conviction for vehicle theft.

<sup>8</sup> Health and Safety Code section 11352(a) denotes a felony conviction for transportation for sale of heroin.

Note: The realignment legislation changed the good time/work time custody credits that are "earned" by prisoners against the above sentences. By law each defendant is only required to serve one-half of the commitment noted, or, put another way, 50% of the sentence imposed.

The **post-supervision** column indicates whether a sentence has been "split," meaning the defendant's overall sentence is split by order of the Court between time incarcerated in the county jail and time on mandatory supervision upon release. If the defendant's sentence is not split, then he or she will not have any probation or parole-like supervision upon completion of their full sentence.
