

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT Innovation Plan Extension Request the Round Valley Crisis Response Project



For the Round Valley Crisis Response Project Public Posting and 30-Day Public Comment Period 04/24/2020 -05/25/2020

This Extension Request is made to provide additional time to fulfill the learning objectives of the Round Valley Crisis Response Innovation project. This project explores a community driven approach to resolving crisis needs, and seeks to provide culturally responsive services in a less institutional setting. To this end, the Center of Healing Hearts was created. The Center has focused on offering traditional healing techniques and connection to cultural heritage along with with peer counseling services for individuals experiencing significant stress, aiming to reduce the volume of crisis level contacts in the Round Valley area. If granted, the extension will allow the project to continue its learning phase through Fiscal Year 2021-22, making use of unspent funding previously approved.

The project will continue to test and learn about:

- Enhancement of respectful communication, collaboration as an approach to trust-building, overcoming historical distrust
- New outreach and engagement strategies and approaches, including traditional Native American cultural activities and healing practices;
- Trauma informed care, addressing historical and intergenerational trauma
- Local collaboration and coordination for services and interventions
- Capacity building approaches for sustainability
