We would like to offer this letter of support for the installation of a new cellular tower to be installed in the area of Manzanita Drive on Pine Mountain. We support the installation of this cell tower because of the redundancy in communication it will bring to first responders, and therefore support the FirstNet mission within Mendocino County and the State of California.

Mendocino County has experienced multiple incidents in recent years with fire, law, EMS, emergency management, public works and PG&E Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) that have identified "lack of communication" as an emergency response shortfall, including alert and warning.

Please consider this cell tower installation as an important infrastructure partner in alert and warning and emergency response. It will help with information distribution such as evacuation orders, operational planning, address identification, mapping, technology application and most of all, transferring medical response information between units in the field and the hospital.
