Are Gatherings Permitted?

Even though we miss our friends and family, the safest choice is to avoid all gatherings. Gatherings are events or meetings that bring together people from multiple households or living units at the same time for a shared or group experience in a single room, space or place (even outdoors). Every time we meet with others, we increase the risk of getting COVID-19 and passing it on to the other members of our household, or passing it on unknowingly to members of other households. For this reason the State and local health officer Orders prohibit all public and private professional, social and community gatherings (except for very limited purposes) because they pose an especially high danger of transmission and spread for COVID-19.

Currently, the State and local orders restrict permissible gatherings to outdoor Place of Worship faith-based services and cultural ceremonies; outdoor funeral and memorial services; as well as outdoor protests. Facial coverings must be worn by all participants in accordance with the facial covering order and physical distancing of at least 6 feet is required at all times between all persons from different households, living units or Stable Bubbles. Due to the increased risk of transmission (even outdoors), the Health Officer has also limited capacity to a maximum of 50 persons. The Health Officer does not consider drive-in/drive-through activities as gatherings, if participants follow the Guidelines for Drive-In and Drive-Through Events, stay in their cars and otherwise remain apart from individuals in separate households, living units or Stable Bubbles.
