RE: Grand Jury Report – Juvenile Probation

Findings:

30) Juvenile Drug Court was suspended for lack of funding.

Response: Respondent agrees with this finding.

31) Probation Department includes partnership programs with PACE, Clean & Sober, River School, and Juvenile Hall.

Response: Respondent agrees with this finding.

32) Youth in Juvenile Hall are not eligible for Medi-CAL services while incarcerated, previous services are terminated while youth are incarcerated.

Response: Respondent agrees with this finding

33) Mendocino County Youth Project provides mental health services to youth and families as well as services while youth are at Juvenile hall.

Response: Respondent agrees with this finding.

Recommendations:

1) Health and Human Services Agency continue to maximize programs to serve youth and maintain partnerships with non-profit agencies. (Findings 1-2, 11, 14-19, 22-23, 28-30, 33)

Response: This recommendation has been implemented, Probation continues to support partnerships with HHSA and non-profit agencies to maximize programs.

3) Support be given to HHSA, Children Systems of Care and in-county programs that diagnose and treat youth with mental health issues. (Findings 4-5, 11, 14-16, 19, 22-24, 31)

Response: This recommendation has been implemented; Probation continues to participate in Children Systems of Care and support in-county programs providing mental health services for youth.

4) HHSA continue to pursue funding for alcohol and drug treatment programs for youth and contract with non-profits for counseling. (Findings 18-19, 22-24, 26-27, 30-31, 33)

Response: Probation continues to support HHSA in pursuing funding for alcohol and drug treatment programs for youth and contracting with non-profits for counseling.

5) The Probation Department/Courts reinstate Juvenile Drug Court and find funding for Teen Court, (VORP). (Findings 3, 18-19, 24, 26-29, 30-31)

Response: The recommendation has not been implemented due to budget constraints. The Probation Department plans to reinstate the Juvenile Drug Court and assist in locating funding for Teen Peer Court, (VORP) when budgeting allows.
