36.	Total income for Fiscal Year (FY) 2007-08 was \$992,729, including \$268,942 from AAA as partial funding for group and home delivered meals, community outreach and the Day Care Center.	Disagree partially with finding. Including one-time-only funds total AAA income for FY 2007-2008 was \$235,496.
48.	Participation in the congregate meal program has increased steadily over the last five years. In FY 2002-03 the Center served 21,412 meals; in FY 2007-08 it served 26,895.	Disagree partially with finding. AAA records indicate 25,857 congregate (C1) meals served by RCS in FY 2007-08.

51	The Meals-on-Wheels program is implemented by one paid employee and several volunteers. All are reimbursed for mileage traveled at the federal rate.	Disagree with this finding. There are 8 paid employees (allocated 10% to 100% to MOW) and several volunteers.
56.	Day Care Center participation has declined steadily from a peak of 2,257 census days in FY 2005-06 to 1,572 census days in FY 2007-08. Even after reducing service from five to four days weekly, the program currently has difficulty achieving the minimum average daily census of ten participants that is required for AAA funding. The program has not been actively marketed. The (former) Executive Director cited affordability as one reason	Disagree partially with finding.
