

RESOLUTION NO. 08-093

RESOLUTION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPTING A NEGATIVE DECLARATION UNDER CEQA FOR THE EAST SIDE POTTER VALLEY ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, CR 240 BETWEEN M.P. 2.46 AND M.P. 6.42 (POTTER VALLEY AREA)

WHEREAS, East Side Potter Valley Road, CR 240, between M.P. 2.46 and M.P. 6.42 is severely deteriorated and in need of reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Department of Transportation proposes to remove and reconstruct and widen the applicable segment of East Side Potter Valley Road; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has obtained State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) funding for the East Side Potter Valley Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has performed an Initial Study under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for reconstruction of the above mentioned segment of Eastside Potter Valley Road (CR 240).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors finds that the environmental impacts identified for the East Side Potter Valley Road Improvement Project (CR 240 between M.P. 2.46 and M.P. 6.42, Potter Valley Area) can be adequately mitigated through the conditions of approval or features of the project design so that no significant adverse environmental impacts will result from the project and therefore a Mitigated Negative Declaration is adopted.




