## **Human Resources Update**

#### Classification and Compensation Study Update:

The first phase of the County's classification and compensation is now underway. The entire study will be comprised of four phases and is expected to take approximately 12 months to complete. Phase One includes a review of 50 employee classifications representing all bargaining units as well as a review of the current system being used to assign salary grades.

#### The Work of Leadership:

On December 20, 2017, representatives from the County's seven leadership project teams will be making their first presentations to the Mendocino County Executive Leadership Team (MCELT). These presentations will include updates on their work to date including the development of their short and long term project goals.

#### California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) Audit:

In November of 2015, Mendocino County officially transitioned Merit classifications in the Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) and Child Support to Civil Service. During the week of November 27, 2017, Cooperative Personnel Services (CPS), on behalf of CalHR, completed a two day, on-site audit to assess Mendocino County's compliance with the six federal merit principles related to our hiring and employment practices. They looked into recruitment and testing, retention and compensation, training, disciplinary processes, Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) concerns and fair treatment issues. In an exit meeting with the on-site reviewers, they indicated the County was found to be compliant in all six areas and will receive the final report within the next few weeks. During the meeting, they complimented the County's recruitment files, new employee orientation, employee discipline process, and the employee training program.

## Request for Proposal (RFP) Update

#### Information Technology Master Plan Update:

The final contract for the Information Technology Master Plan between the County of Mendocino and ClientFirst was approved on December 5, 2017. An IT Master Plan kick-off occurred on December 12. 2017. representatives from all County departments were invited to attend and learn more about the project. ClientFirst will be meeting with each department to conduct a needs assessment in mid-January. Upon completion of the needs assessments, ClientFirst will move forward with conducting an inventory of technology, the research and development of a preliminary plan, hold planning and prioritization workshops and create a final report and presentations which will be made to County Executive Management and to the County Board of Supervisors. Future dates have only been selected for the needs assessments; however, the estimated time frame for project completion is 6 months

## **HHSA Update**

#### Foster Family Fall Festival Event:

Health and Human Services hosted their annual Foster Family Event on November 9, 2017, bringing together foster families and children from around the County. This Fall Festival included potato sack races, cake walks, and arts and crafts. Children were able to make turkey pinecones, homemade placemats, and compete in donut eating contests. Dinner was provided for all attendees as well as a safe, laughter-filled atmosphere to relax and enjoy Fall. Staff members were able to share in the fun with many of the foster children and their caregivers. It is these interactions and opportunities that provide foster families with a wonderful start to their holiday season.

#### **HHSA Fire Recovery Support:**

HHSA is supporting the Redwood Fire Recovery related work in multiple ways:

- Community Outreach Unit is leading the effort to set up longerterm case management in partnership with North Coast Opportunities and the Ukiah Valley Conference Center. A press release with specifics will be available shortly.
- Environmental Health is working with Planning and Building Services and state and national agencies to protect our residents during fire debris clean up.
- Many HHSA staff provided the required County presence during Stage 1 of debris removal.

## Cobblestone Contract Administration Implementation

The County's new contract management software system, CobblestoneSystems – Contract Insight Enterprise Edition, implementation is underway. The installation of the software was completed last week. The County's project team will then begin implementation and training with the vendor. It is anticipated that one department will be selected to beta test the system prior to full implementation throughout the County. The software will be a major improvement in writing, processing and tracking contracts. The system will eventually include a web portal that will allow public access to approved contracts.

## **Animal Shelter Update**

#### Animal Shelter to Host Spay and Neuter Day for Feral Cats:

On Tuesday, December 12, 2017, Animal Care Services and the Care-A-Van will held a no cost spay and neuter clinic for feral cats at the Animal Shelter located at 298 Plant Road, Ukiah.

Feral cats are the same species as pet cats, but they live outdoors and can't be socialized with people. Sterilizing feral cats is essential to a program called Trap-Neuter-Return, which ends the breeding cycle and makes feral cat's better neighbors.

Approximately 21 feral cats were altered. The local rescue group, SNAP, assisted in the Spay and Neuter Day.

#### Puppy Play Area:

The puppy play area is currently being redone. The improvements include: a new concrete surface that replaces a dirt and wood shaving surface, a new fence which will be either aluminum or steel and replaces a wooden fence and sun screens for overtop that will provide protection from the elements.

The improvements were recommended by the UC Davis Assessment that was conducted in March, 2017. The project greatly improves the aesthetics & reduces the transmissions of zoonotic diseases.

#### **Outcome Statistics:**

From November 1-30, 2017, 26 dogs were adopted, 24 cats were adopted, 91 animals were transferred to rescue organizations and 49 animals were returned to their owners. The live release rate was 92%.


